SMART PAYMENTS



However, Doxo.com may charge the member extra fees and your cooperative cannot control when we will receive the member payments from Doxo.com. This could possibly result in a late payment from the member or even disconnection due to non-payment. 2 Eggs

3/4 Cup Milk

2/3 Cup Finely Crushed Saltines

1/2 Cup Chopped Onion

1 Teaspoon Salt

1/2 Teaspoon Sage

Dash Pepper

1 1/2 lbs Lean Ground Beef

1 Cup Ketchup

1/2 Cup Packed Brown Sugar

1 Teaspoon Worcestershire Sauce

In a large bowl, beat eggs, add milk, saltines, onion, salt, sage and pepper. Add beef and mix well. Shape into and 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" loaf in an ungreased shallow baking pan. Combine remaining ingredients; spread 3/4 cup over meat loaf. Bake at 350° for 60-65 minutes or until no pink remains; drain. Let stand 10 minutes before slicing. Serve with remaining sauce. Yield 6-8 servings.
